A new Vision and vibrancy are filling our Precinct

One of the CBD's newest landmark, Vision on Morphett Street, is on track for completion in April.

Developed by Australia China Development Company, Vision rises 18 floors offering 186 residential units, including a penthouse. Inspire Real Estate is the selling agent.

Inspire Real Estate is also the master agent for Central Adelaide residential development on Grote Street, just west of the Morphett Street intersection (the old Dreamland site).

Expected to be completed late next year, Central Adelaide will feature a host of exclusive amentities including a cinema, pool, BBQ area, gym and business office suite with sweeping views of the city, hills and beach from a beautifully landscaped sky garden. Retail tenancies will also form part of the development.

Commenting on Inspire's considerable involvement in Adelaide, Managing Director Calvin Lai said, "We are extremely excited to be part of the increasingly vibrant City landscape and look forward to more business opportunities in the future."

Grote Business Precinct is working with Council regarding laneway activation for thoroughfares such as Pitt Street and Trades Hall Lane. A project in a similar vein is the beautification of the Bus Depot space that adjoins the Hampshire Cider House and The Joinery.

The right balance of residential, commercial, retail and community uses in the City will contribute to a liveable, active and commercially viable centre.

Council assists new Rest-O-Bar

Council's \$200,000 Activation and Business Start-up Fund to encourage small business start-ups in underutilised buildings has made the opening of Yo! India a reality.

Yo! India Rest–O–Bar at 222 Morphett Street offers authentic Indian cuisine and is the first of eight successful applicants to benefit from the scheme.

Lord Mayor Martin Haese (pictured far right chatting with Proprietor Ashish Batra) was on hand to celebrate on opening night. "Upgrading building amenities and alterations is precisely what the grants are intended to be used for," commented Mayor Haese. "I wish Yo! India every success."

Yo! India's four directors come from different areas of the food, beverage and entertainment industries.

The grant enabled them to convert a vacant Morphett Street property including refurbishing bathrooms, replace flooring and fitout the kitchen to provide a restaurant and function room with capacitiy for 150 people.
