## City Gateway funding win for the Precinct

Grote Business Precinct (GBP) President, David Buenfeld, delighted with the news of Council funding for a grand Western entry to the City.

Adelaide City Council has allocated a 2017-2018 capital works budget of \$950,000 for an entry statement at the Western end on Sir Donald Bradman Drive opposite Grote Street.

David commented, "This intersection is a direct entry to the City Centre from Adelaide Airport and Keswick Rail Terminal and is a visitor's first impression of our City."

This is a project that Grote Business Precinct, the Gouger Street Traders Association, Chinatown and Adelaide Central Market have lobbied for over a number of years.

This Market District group pushed for the entry statement as well as redevelopment of Chinatown and Central Market Plaza.

Grote Business Precinct is also hoping completion of the Grote Street upgrade, from Morphett Street to West Terrace, will soon become a Council priority.



### The Maj's Makeover Is To Be Even Grander



Launched in April, the Her Majesty's Theatre Renewal will be a \$66.2 million project.

The project cost has increased due to structural issues and identification of new opportunities, including a fourth level gallery and function space that will be able to operate independently of the theatre.

An additional Back of House floor will help to alleviate a shortage of rehearsal space in Adelaide and will also provide a boutique performance space.

Adelaide Festival Centre Foundation must raise at least \$3M over the next 3 years to ensure the project is completed fully.

Her Majesty's Theatre has been entertaining Adelaide for more than a hundred years. The Grand Old Dame was built as part of the legendary vaudeville circuit and in fact, is the only original Tivoli theatre still standing. Through two World Wars and a devastating depression, through the onslaught of talkies and television, this great theatre has steadfastly served her community.

62 Grote Street, adjacent to Her Maj, will be redeveloped with a four level modern structure in harmony with the heritage-listed Her Majesty's Theatre building. This will be good for patrons, local artists and Adelaide.

Benefits of the redevelopment include:

- Increased seating capacity
- More commercial blockbusters coming to Adelaide
- New fover spaces and improved disability access
- Upgraded technical equipment and orchestra pit
- New modern bathrooms on each level
- Increased jobs and ongoing employment
- Renewed activation of the Market/Chinatown/ Grote Street area
- Cultural and entertainment linkage from Adelaide Oval through to Gouger Street

In recent times Her Majesty's has hosted up to 100,000 people a year. It is anticipated this will grow to 250,000 a year with more big productions attracted by the larger venue.

# Food for the Homeless Project continues

Now in its 8<sup>th</sup> year, the Rotary Club of Adelaide West's community project continues with the generousity of Adelaide Central Market Traders and Grote Business Precinct members.

Every fortnight stocks of unsold products at the end of the Market's Saturday trade are collected and distributed to the homeless. In the past year \$18,000 worth of food went to the Salvation Army and St. Vincent De Paul refuges and to support homeless mothers.

\$100,000 of food was collected from 2010 until June this year, through 1,750 hours of time volunteered by Rotary Adelaide West members and friends.

## Still waiting for final upgrade

The infrastructure upgrades provided a boost for trader confidence, local residents and visitors alike. The road was resurfaced, 33 mature trees were planted, footpaths were improved and public art, additional seating, litter bins and bike racks were installed.



While enthusiastic about Council's plan for a statement gateway to welcome visitors to the City, local traders including these representatives of Chinese Welfare Services, Upstream Health, Beaumont Tiles, Your Child's Nursery, Ausland Elevators and Belle Property, remain focused on achieving the completion of the Grote Street upgrade.

Improvements were also made to lighting and stormwater drainage


