GBP President thanked Gary for his contribution to the GBP committee and welcomed his replacement, Executive Business Manager Ravinder Singh to the committee. Gary then introduced restaurant owner Luigi from Luigi's Deli on Flinders Street who plans to open a new eatery on the ground level in October.

### **GBP President's Report 2019**

The last 12 months has seen some changes to our committee & Precinct. Former committee member Franz Knoll secured a role as Adelaide City Councillor, active member Peer Norsell from the Hilton Hotel relocated after 6 years to South Korea and long serving member Terry Peacock resigned from the committee.

Sadly, La Boheme, Liquid Hair and Bendigo Bank have closed in our precinct however new businesses such as Wild Nectre and Baby Bay have moved into the surrounding areas. We still have a number of sizable vacancies throughout the precinct and foresee the following year to be challenging with uncertainty around the Market Arcade redevelopment – with some companies choosing not to renew their lease or sell their business. The latest change was announced last week – Comida is moving out of the markets & into Grenfell Street. It was reported the decision was largely due to the uncertainty of the Central Market Arcade Development and allowing a commercial tenancy like Chemist Warehouse take up occupancy.

Last year we embarked on a new Christmas promotion distributing 2,500 lollipops with 70 instant prizes from our local traders. Due to its success, we're pleased to say we've secured funding for 2019 to repeat the promotion.

In February we saw in the Lunar New Year with the unveiling of the 'Year of the Pig' artwork at the entrance to Chinatown. The event was well attended with honorary guests Deputy Lord Mayor Cr Houssam Abiad, Federal Minister for Trade and Tourism Senator Simon Birmingham, Hon. Jing Lee MLC & artist Jake Holmes. Pleased to say the event made channel 7 news twice that day.

Good news stories across the precinct also includes St Mary's College celebrated its 150<sup>th</sup> birthday & opened its new Veritas Centre, West Franklin apartment complex was completed and welcomed residents in February, the Foodprint Experience won Best Green Business, Quest on Franklin entered the Trip Advisor Hall of Fame – certificate of excellence for the last 5 years.

Still to come this year is the completion of the GPO Tower, another 6 green star rated building with confirmed tenants BHP moving 600 employees from Grenfell Street & Attorney General's Dep. relocating from Pirie Street.

In recent weeks, GBP has provided a letter of support for an application for greening / upgrade of Grote Street, from West Terrace to Morphett Street. We'll also continue to lobby for the East West Bikeway through Franklin Street as many local stakeholders are in supportive of the \$5.5m development which would see widening of footpaths and more street trees.

2020 will see us continue to work through our activity plan for the current financial year and beyond, and I'm most excited about our newly established advisory teams:

- Eco focusing on environmental sustainability in our precinct
- Marketing repositioning the branding of Market Quarter both online & in print, creating further alignment with 'Adelaide, A City Designed for Life'
- Strategic Plan focus group largely around the grant application & how the plan will be implemented
- Christmas Activity funding grant execution

I would like to thank our committee members, executives and particularly our coordinator Yvonne for her support over the past 12 months. I look forward continuing our initiatives and particularly look forward to seeing how this strategic plan will map the future of the Grote Business Precinct.
