
Big Santa has been absent for two years, awaiting costly repairs after decades of wear and tear.




And developments have been exciting.


The recent changes to Grote Street, particularly at the Western end where we are, have been incredible and have blended in with the history which is still very much part of the atmosphere here.





Digital twinning IT studies arrive at St Mary's College



St Mary's College is delighted to partner with Digital Twinning Australia (DTA) on a pioneering project to introduce students to the skills required to succeed in the digital workforce of the future.

DTA is an Adelaide-based, woman-owned and operated Australian leader in applied Industry 4.0, also known as the fourth industrial revolution.

This partnership with St Mary's College will see DTA build and operate a digital twin (with live data feeds) of the solar energy system that is on the Veritas Centre, using a 3D Model of the building obtained from Grieve Gillet Anderson, the Centre's architects.

The St Mary's digital twin project offers a unique teaching tool to hone students digital skills for future genderless STEM careers.
