

A shared and dynamic vision



The City of Adelaide and the State Government share a vision for how the former Adelaide Bus Station site fronting Franklin Street will be developed.

Plans and concept drawings (such as the one above) show a mixed-use high-rise development capable of housing more than 1,000 new residents. To be known as Tapangka ("the experience of the journey" in the Kaurna language) the proposed development is to include a 208-room hotel, 392 apartments, civic centre and commercial space across two towers: one of 18 storeys and the other 26.

Conservation SA's head office is The Joinery, which currently occupies what was the former bus station's administration building.
