

Works on southern end of Pitt Street progress

Current program of works

Works are continuing in our eastern work zone as well as at the southern end of Pitt Street near the Grote Street intersection. The pedestrian crossing across Pitt Street at Grote Street has been reopened.

Works include installation of the tree vaults, new pram ramps and kerbing. We will be in this location for the coming weeks.

All works will continue to be undertaken from 7am – 5pm Monday to Friday. We will endeavour to undertake any noisier activities e.g. saw-cutting, jackhammering, hydro-excavation after 8am.

Vehicle Access on Pitt Street

There is no change to vehicle access this week. Pitt Street will continue to be **one way** with traffic movement **northbound** (from Grote Street to Franklin Street). There will be **no entry** to Pitt Street from Franklin Street (Care Park customers excepted).

The underground car park that accesses Pitt Street is not be accessible while we are in this work zone. We expect to be able to reinstate access in early May and will keep you updated on this.

Pedestrian access on Pitt Street

Pedestrians will need to cross to the western side of Pitt Street as the eastern footpath will be closed during this time. Gangways are in place to allow pedestrians to access **24 Pitt Street, the Hobby Room and Grandcarers SA**. Access to the **Art Room** will be via 24 Pitt Street. Additional lower height fencing has also been put in place to encourage pedestrians to cross Pitt Street at safer locations.

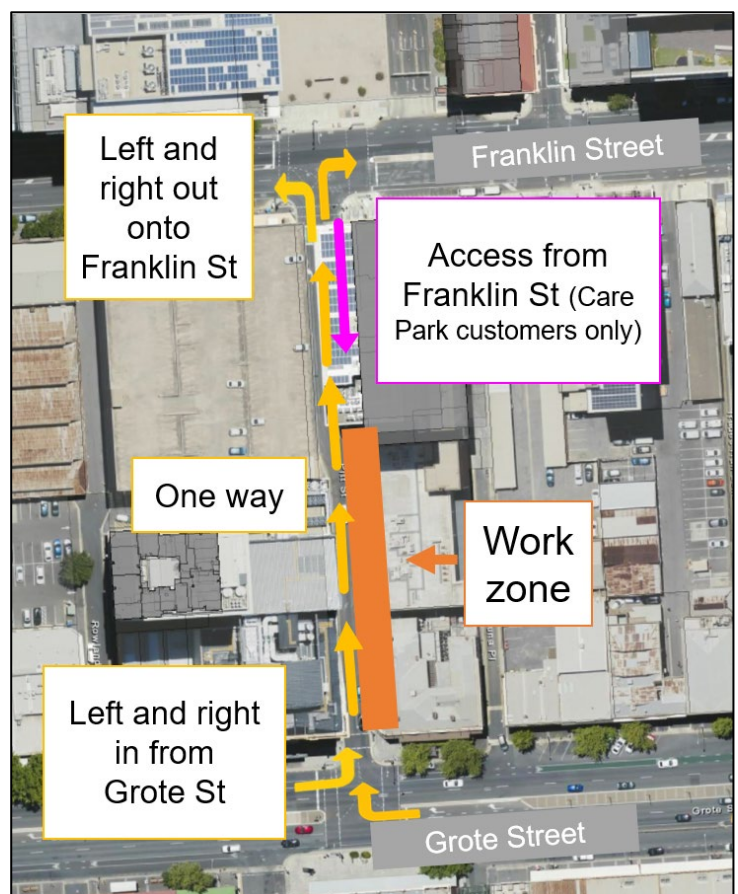
Access to **Pitt Street Café** will be via the ramp entrance.

Access to **Hotel Metropolitan** will be via the entrance on Grote Street (Pitt Street entrance will be closed).

The pram ramps across Grote Street at the Hotel Metropolitan will reopen on Monday 8 April.

Following this we will close the pram ramp near Her Majesty's Theatre, and this is due to be reopened mid-week.

Temporary access signage and pram ramps will be in place to safely accommodate pedestrians.



Access – Care Park

Care Park customers can use Franklin Street or Grote Street ends of Pitt Street. Entry to Pitt Street from Franklin Street will be for Care Park car park access only.

When exiting the Care Park, customers will only be able to turn left onto Pitt Street, turning left or right onto Franklin Street. There is no right turn from the car park onto Pitt Street to head south towards Grote Street.

Advance notice is provided that the vehicle access will only be available from Franklin Street from 15-28 April 2024.

There will also be some minor interruptions to access on Friday 26 April while our team reprofile the road at the Care Park entry. This will impact vehicles entering the car park in the morning – please be advised there may be some delays, but the car park remains open for business and our team will be able to help motorists entering the car park. We expect works to be complete by mid-afternoon.

Pitt Street car parking

There have been changes made to on-street car parking along Pitt Street in order for us to accommodate the work site and through traffic. A dedicated disabled permit park is available outside of Uniting Communities (near Goodwill). Please note that this is a parallel park (not 45 degree angle), additional bollards have been placed on site to guide users.

Forward work program

The intersection of Grote Street and Pitt Street will be closed from 15-28 April 2024. Vehicle movement will not be available from Grote Street during this time. Pedestrian access will be maintained along Pitt Street (north south movement), noting that pedestrians crossing Pitt St on Grote Street will need to use the southern side of Grote Street. We will continue to keep you updated on this.

Road reprofiling will be undertaken on Friday 26 April. This involves milling and removing the top layer of the road and this will cause some noise and access impacts. We apologise for the inconvenience and our team on site will work to ensure vehicles and pedestrians can safely move around Pitt Street.
